Secretary Report: Annual General Meeting 2023

"Those we love don't go away; they walk beside us every day. Unseen, unheard but always near, still loved, still missed and very dear".

Clara GAA Club and community were shocked and sadden by the untimely passing of James 'Shiner' Nolan on the 27^{th of} January 2023. James was loved by all who knew him. As a neighbour I enjoyed meeting James on the road, he never passed without a friendly wave, a smile that left me wondering what was that all about or stopping to have a word about how things were going with the club; he was especially friendly nearing the All-Ireland Football Final, when the banter would start for tickets. In those darkest of days for James' family, friends and teammates, Clara GAA Club rallied around each other, supporting one another and navigating a way through their grief. Thank you to all members for uniting as a club, you made me proud to be from Clara GAA. To the Nolan family I extend heartfelt condolences. James' memory will live on in our club as one of our brightest stars. Ar dheis Dé go raimh a anam dílis.

Under new management of Martin Byrne, Mick Purcell, Alan Malone, Michael McDonald and Tom Murphy and captained by Liam Ryan, the Senior Hurlers started back training in March. The St. Canice's Senior/ Intermediate League was a challenging competition, but it allowed time for players and mentors to get to know one another and for the introduction of our youngest adult players to gel with their more established teammates. The league proper had us pitted against Dicksboro in the opening round, the result (Clara 3-11 Dicksboro 5-18) poked holes in our structure that needed repairing. We found form against Danesfort, overcoming them in Bennettsbridge by 10 points (Clara 0-23 Danesfort 0-13). We will never forget the weather conditions that framed the game against Tullaroan on the 18th August, it was a battle of stamina rather than a game of hurling and despite good performances from our players, Tullaroan proved to be more equipped for the storm (Clara 2-08 Tullaroan 1-16). A disappointing performance against O Loughlin's (Clara 1-19 OLG 0-29) had pundits tagging us for relegation. We knew we needed a big game against Mullinavat, played in extreme weather conditions, this time in sweltering heat, Clara stepped it up several notches and delighted our supporters with a 4-19 to 1-15 win. This improvement unfortunately didn't last and we were outplayed in the first round of the Championship by Graigue Ballycallan (Clara 1-14 GBC 1-18). An early finish to the senior hurling year that has left players bowed but unbroken. Thanks to Conor Phelan (Templemartin), Tom Armitage and Aaron Byrne (Physio) who all played a part in this year's back-room team.

Our **Senior Football** team were managed this year by Alan Coleman, playing Railyard GFC, Muckalee and Mullinavat in the league coming off second in all games. The Senior football championship proved to be a more favourable competition for Clara overcoming O' Loughlin Gaels and Mooncoin, but Thomastown proved too strong in the Semi Final.











The 2023 **Junior Team** was managed by Jack o Keeffe, Michael McDonald, John Phelan and Tom Armitage. There were mixed results in the league games, with a panel that was at times stretched to fulfil fixtures in Junior and Junior D games. Nevertheless, we equipped ourselves well and the last game of the season against Lisdowney in the Championship Quarter Final was a fight to the end, extra time saw the game go in favour of our opponents. Despite a score line of Clara 4-18 to Lisdowney's 2-28, there was little else our team could have done on the day.

Our **Junior D** team was led this year by James Dowling, Tom Armitage, Conor Phelan (Templemartin) and John Carrigan. Its always a challenge to keep a third team going in a country club, that doesn't have an urban area, but we were lucky this year to have good numbers in U18, these lads greatly supported the Junior teams. We had good performances in the league and reaching the Quarter final it was disappointing to come out second best to Lisdowney. Going forward we will again be challenged to field a third team, but I encourage all available players to commit to the club and drive us on. The more players we have hurling for our adult teams the better it is for all players, our terms and club.

Thanks to Brian Glynn, Paschal Connolly, Paul Cody and Ben Nolan who had a challenging time finding any dry evening to train the **U21 team**, but they managed it and despite a promising challenge game against O Loughlin Gaels, Tullaroan were ahead of us at the final whistle in the Roinn D quarter final (Clara 1-11 Tullaroan 1-17).

Thanks to Trevor Cummins & Barry Power along with Stephen Quinlan, Chris Bolger and Brian Glynn, who took charge of the **U19** team this year. The league games were hindered by player availability due to the nearness to the leaving certificate. The quarter final of the championship was a hard game that saw us coming out second best to Barrow Rangers.

Well done to all our club players who represented Clara at County level throughout the year. To all managers, mentors and support teams at all grades this year, on behalf of the players and club members I extend our gratitude to you all for your commitment to the teams. We are lucky in Clara to have dedicated teachers in **St. Colman's School** that put a huge focus on developing hurling, camogie and football skills of the students, our club no doubt benefits from this commitment.

Clara Camogie and Ladies Football Club and the GAA strive to work together to promote our games, this year has been no different to other years in this regard. As we wait for direction from Croke Park regarding a clear pathway to amalgamating all Gaelic Game Codes, we are so fortunate in





Clara that we embrace so much of the One Club ethos, we need to work on this ourselves locally as it could be many years before we get appropriate direction from higher up the ladder.

As agreed at the AGM in 2023, going forward we will have a **Bord na nÓg** report as part of the agenda in our main club AGM, thank you to Theresa Aylward for compiling the BnG report. The BnG is largest part of our club, we need all the support we can get from parents, grandparents and friends at this level. If you are interested in becoming involved in a team, contact us; "ní neart go cur le chéile".



It is a great achievement to reach an All-Ireland final in any sport and it was a huge achievement to have two Clara Club players participating in this year's **Puc Fada** competition on the Cooley Mountains. Matt Kenny represented Kilkenny and Leinster having won both competitions, Kilian Phelan was on the mountain as returning All-Ireland Champion. There was a huge Clara following and all were delighted to witness Kilian's and Matt's success, who finished in fourth and fifth respectively on the day.

We always welcome the opportunity to host games in Clara, it is how we can show off all that is good in our club; we have great facilities and a great pitch, other clubs really like coming to play in Clara. Thank you to all the stewards who volunteered throughout 2023, we couldn't have hosted any game without your help. We aim to take care of our pitches in Clara with the help of a few people. This would not be possible without the trojan work of our club volunteers; I want to make special mention to John Shortall, who cut the pitches, Johnny made sure the pitches were match ready all year. Thanks to David Mulrooney who has been always on hand to help and advice regarding pitch care. John Dowling, has kept the pitches marked to perfection all year, getting huge praise from visiting team along the way. Looking after our pitches isn't an easy job and sometimes the tough decision to close the facility needs to be made; this is not done to annoy or inconvenience anyone but to ensure all teams have a pitch to train on or play on, at the business end of the year. Thanks to everyone for your understanding.

The **Club Shop** has become a focus for patrons on match days, people from far and wide know they will get a warm welcome and an excellently brewed tea or coffee in the SIOPA in Clara. This year our patrons had the pleasure of being served by Ed Mulrooney, Siobhán Carrigan. Martina Firbank and Threasa Garrahy. It would be remiss of me not to mention the young helpers in the club; if I name them, I will surely leave someone out, but thank you to the boys and girls who helped me so often this year to put out and take in the flags, keep an eye on the shop and help cleaning out the dressing rooms.
